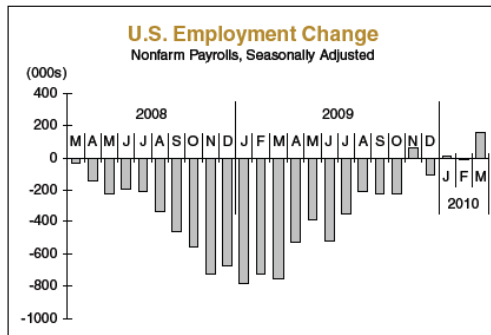

### EDITOR'S NOTE:

Employment rose by 162,000 in March, and the unemployment rate was **9.7 percent** for the third month in a row. Job gains continued in temporary help services and in health care, while job losses occurred in financial activities and in information. The March employment increase also included 48,000 workers hired by the federal government for Census 2010. **Bureau of Labor Statistics.**



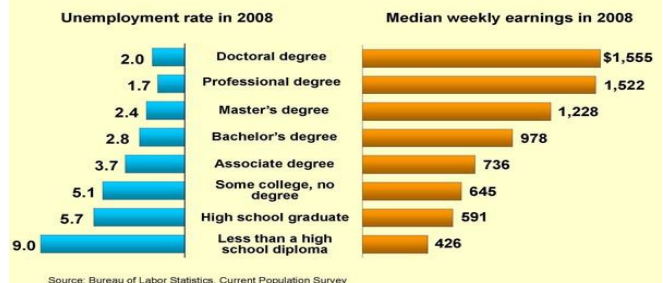
**BIG SWING:** The U.S. economy added an average of 54,000 jobs monthly during 2010's first quarter. While not impressive versus traditional employment gains, the 54,000 average *rise* is worlds apart from the 753,000 average monthly *loss* during 2009's first quarter. Job gains in March were spread across the economy. An estimated 60% of industries added jobs in March, the highest share in four years (*CNNMoney.com*).

While the U.S. economy officially added 162,000 jobs during March, the household survey estimated a much stronger 264,000 rise. More importantly, while the establishment survey noted a net gain of an identical 162,000 jobs during the first quarter just ended, the household survey estimates that total employment jumped by 1.1 million jobs during the quarter! Many economists would suggest that the household survey can be a better measure of job gains during transition periods from job contraction to job creation.

**VALUE OF EDUCATION:** It comes as no surprise that one's educational attainment typically has a direct impact on employment. The jobless rate for those workers with less than a high school diploma was 14.5% in March. For those with a high school diploma, but no college, the rate was 10.8%. For those workers with some college or an Associate's degree, the jobless rate was 8.2%. For those with a Bachelor's degree and higher, the average unemployment rate was 4.9%.



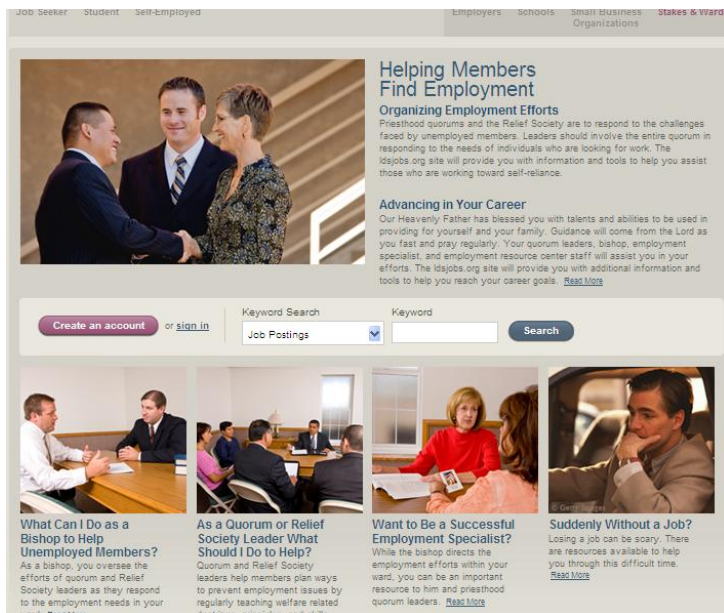
### Education pays



**DOWN THE ROAD:** Gains in employment have been, and typically are, the final piece of the economic growth puzzle. Most estimates suggest the economy began to grow again last summer. Renewed growth has occurred in part due to massive government stimulus. Such growth has also occurred despite government. We have been through the economic wringer during the past 27 months, twisted and wrenched in ways thought unlikely until it actually happened. Millions of people remain unemployed, with job prospects meager for simply too many. **Step Two:** Go to Jobs, DC's #1 Source for jobs at [Washingtonpost.com/jobs](http://Washingtonpost.com/jobs) and search by Job Titles, Location, Function, Employers, Industry and Career Level. The 11,000 open positions available right now are in DC and the immediate suburbs. Many more exit outside the beltway perimeter.  
**Step Three:** Make an appointment with your local LDS Employment Center, receive counseling, attend a Career Workshop and receive a variety of resources that will match your career objectives.

**TRADITIONAL WAYS**

- Rely on Resume
- Mail Resume randomly
- Newspaper Ads
- Do little or no Networking
- Send same resume to all Internet Job Opportunities
- Do not send Thank You letters to Interviewers
- Do not send Cover Letters with Resume
- Rely just on Internet
- Mindset is "I'll take any job now"
- May keep Job Search a private affair
- Apprehensive about changing direction

**REGISTER AT LDSJOBS.ORG**

- Create a written plan, professional resume, assess skills
- Attend 2-day LDS Employment "Career Workshop"
- Understand the 7 Rules of Networking
- Create "30 Second Statements" & "Power Statements"
- Practice Mock Interviewing –see LDS ERC services
- Research Companies and target resume to each position
- Ask Contacts for referrals and send Thank You letters.
- Identify opportunities On-line
- Approach companies directly
- Let friends, associates know you are searching
- Spend 6-8 hours/day productively and get a Coach
